WORKSHEET - CONTEXT CLUES

Context clues are hints found within a sentence, paragraph, or passage, that a reader can use to understand the meanings of new or unfamiliar words. Types of context clues:

- 1. **Definition or description clue.** Look for clues: when you see "such as", and within commas, dashes and parentheses.
- 2. Example clues. Clues are given after words such as including, such as, and for example,
- 3. Synonym restatement clue. Words with the same meaning appears on the sentence.
- 4. Contrast/antonym clue. Look for words like" although", "however, but
- 5. **Mood/tone clue**: The author sets a mood, the meaning of the unknown word must harmonize with the mood.
