Conjunction Notes and Worksheet

A conjunction is a word used to connect or join words, phrases or clauses.

Example:

Dave went to the cinema. **Cal** went to the cinema.

Dave and Cal went to the cinema.

Sue walked **down the street**. She walked **up the path to the store**.

Sue walked down the street and up the path to the store.

The children went to beach. The children met some sailors.

The children went to the beach, and met some sailors.

Main coordinating conjunctions are: and, nor, or, but, neither, either.
